# A BILL

To address food and housing insecurity on college campuses.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Closing the College

5 Hunger Gap Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. INFORMATION ON SNAP ELIGIBILITY.

- 7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 483 of the Higher Edu-
- 8 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1090) is amended by add-
- 9 ing at the end the following:
- 10 "(i) INFORMATION ON SNAP ELIGIBILITY.—

1 "(1) IN GENERAL.—For each year for which a 2 student described in paragraph (2) submits a form described in subsection (a), the Secretary shall send 3 4 to such student information regarding potential eli-5 gibility for assistance under, and application process 6 for, the supplemental nutrition assistance program 7 established under the Food and Nutrition Act of 8 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2011 et seq.) in written and elec-9 tronic form. Both the written and electronic communication shall include contact information for the 10 11 State agency responsible for administering the sup-12 plemental nutrition assistance program in the State 13 in which the student resides.

14 "(2) STUDENTS.—A student is described in this
15 paragraph if the student has an expected family con16 tribution equal to zero for the year.".

17 (b) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary of Education shall consult with the Secretary of Agriculture, and the 18 19 head of any other applicable Federal or State agency, in 20designing the written and electronic communication re-21 garding potential eligibility for assistance under, and ap-22 plication process for, the supplemental nutrition assistance 23 program established under the Food and Nutrition Act of 24 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2011 et seq.) as described in section

- 1 483(i) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.
- 2 1090(i)).

### 3 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- 4 This Act and the amendment made by this Act shall
- 5 take effect 120 days after the date of enactment of this
- 6 Act.
